	<p><i>‘Personalised care and cancer- it’s everyone’s business’.</i></p> <p><i>Ensuring that people living with cancer receive personalised care is everyone’s business, with touchpoints from the point of diagnosis, through to prehab, treatment decisions, acutely unwell episodes, good quality cancer care review conversations, needs assessments, gaining support from social prescribers and courageous end of life care conversations. The COVID-19 pandemic has notably impacted patient care over the past 12-18 months, with changes to ways of working, huge reductions in patients presenting with signs or symptoms of cancer and changes or delays to treatment plans due to infection risk. All of these changes have had an impact on the ability of health and care professionals to continue to ensure the delivery of good quality personalised care for people living with cancer.</i></p> <p><i>In this workshop, we’ll explore the impact of the pandemic on the delivery of personalised care for people living with cancer and will consider how we can sustain positive changes to ways of working and innovative adaptations to delivery of care developed through the pandemic, whilst ensuring that inequalities are not exacerbated as a result. This session will bring together a multi-professional team to consider how we can build on the strengths of different professionals involved in delivering care to people following a cancer diagnosis. Through the use of case studies, we’ll generate an interactive conversation based around the key times of need experienced by cancer patients to draw out what each individual can bring to achieving personalised care supported by evidence and insight throughout.</i></p>
