TBC - AM	<p><b>RDS – ALL WELCOME</b></p> <p>This year the Oncology forum are proud to showcase the inaugural session highlighting Rapid Diagnostic Services (RDS) for patients with non-site specific symptoms (NSS). Patients with NSS (such as weight loss, fatigue or pain) generally do not fit standard two-week rule (2WW) referral criteria and often bounce around systems and take longer to get diagnosed and treated. Rapid Diagnostic Clinics (RDCs) provide a NSS 2WW referral route. These are being expanded across the Country with the aim of providing personalised, coordinated diagnostics to facilitate earlier cancer diagnosis and fast-track care. As well as reducing geographic differences in access to diagnostics. This session aims to bring primary care, diagnosticians, oncologists, radiologists, and nurse practitioners together to share experiences in the development of the RDS and combine thinking on future developments and innovation.</p> <p>Potential themes include:</p> <p><b>1.
